Firstly, I would like to thank the nine board members for their hard work and the commitment of their time to CCWA. This year we had a full complement of dedicated board members. This past year we changed our fiscal year end date to reflect the calendar year. For this reason, we have a shorter reporting period, from April to December of 2023. Next year's AGM, and onwards, will have a full year's reporting period from January to December of each year.
